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Objectives for the ILTS TEG Workshop:

- 1. Match the TEG values with the portion of the hemostasis system of which they reflect the function (R-CK/CKH, MA-kaolin/rapid and MA-FF, LY30)
- 2. Explain how that information from question one can guide treatment of bleeding or thrombosis.
- 3. After examining a TEG tracing, identify which portion of the hemostasis system (factors, fibrinogen, platelets, or fibrinolysis) is dysfunctional.
- Discuss potential benefits of viscoelastic testing in major surgeries (CV, liver transplant, trauma)



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
