Summary:

Dr. Elizabeth A. Wilson is an Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology at Emory University Hospital through Emory University School of Medicine. She graduated from the Lewis Katz School of Medicine at Temple University in 2011. Thereafter she completed a pediatrics residency at Duke University Medical Center, pediatric critical care fellowship at Children's National Health System in Washington, DC, anesthesiology residency at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, and liver transplant anesthesiology fellowship at the University of California San Francisco.

Dr. Wilson is the Director of Didactics and Program Director of the Liver Transplant Anesthesiology Fellowship at Emory. She is a member of the American Society of Anesthesiologists, International Anesthesia Research Society, Society for the Advancement of Transplant Anesthesia, International Liver Transplantation Society, Georgia Society of Anesthesiologists, and American Academy of Pediatrics. Her clinical practice largely involves living and deceased donor liver and kidney transplantation and hepatobiliary, colorectal, and vascular surgery. Her research interests involve the use of serum biomarkers to examine the aberrant immunologic mechanisms underlying early allograft dysfunction due to ischemia reperfusion injury after orthotopic liver transplantation. Dr. Wilson's primary goal is to advance the field of liver transplantation through clinical excellence, academic rigor, and research.
